Federal Government to Prosecute UHS!





RNs & Supporters Rally for Free & Fair Election

The National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) has decided to prosecute UHS for anti-union firm Yessin's interference with the free choice of Inland Valley and Rancho Springs nurses leading up to our original election dates in January.

Charges to be prosecuted include:

- 1. Interrogation
- **2. Threats** of termination, hospital closure, that UHS would never negotiate a contract, etc.
- 3. **Discrimination** based on union activity
- **4. Surveillance** of employees' protected activity
- **5. Creating false hopes** that they would fix problems at the hospital in order to discourage voting for the union

We challenge UHS & Yessin to refrain from intimidation, harassment and threats.
