



Philippines Typhoon Relief

Typhoon Haiyan, considered one of the largest hurricanes in recorded history, has devastated the central Philippine islands, killing thousands and leaving millions homeless.

Feed The Hungry is responding with a commitment to provide between two to three million rations of emergency relief meals for survivors.



FTH immediately wired substantial funds to our relief partners in Manila to purchase tons of rice, canned sardines, and bottled water. Hundreds of volunteers assembled to create family food packs from the supplies; bagging them and loading them onto two forty-foot containers for transport to Cebu via ferry. From there these immediate rations were distributed in north Cebu as well as on Leyte and in Tacloban.



Presently, Feed The Hungry has 688,293 rice & soy meal rations on ocean freighters heading toward the Philippines from Singapore and Long Beach Port.

An additional million-plus rice & soy meals are being sourced by Feed The Hungry to ship to church partners in the devastated areas of the Philippines.

Partnering with Cathedral of Praise, one of the largest churches in the Philippines, relief supplies will be given hand in hand with hope to the suffering. Cathedral of Praise is networked with churches across the affected islands.



With logistics and travel routes now in place, life-saving meals can be delivered for pennies; four cents will deliver one meal ration typhoon survivor in need.

- \$40 delivers 1,000 rations.
- \$100 will provide 2,500 emergency meals to survivors.
- every \$1,000 received will put 25,000 meals into the hands of Philippino families who have lost everything.
- \$10,835 provides shipping and inland logistics to deliver one full container of relief rations to a partner church in the disaster zone.
